Step - by - step approach for JAM

- Smile! Be confident. Don't be nervous.
- Begin with a thanking note.
- Define the topic in simple language.
- Give brief details - Past/Present/Future of the topic.
- Speak with clear and audible voice.
- Use correct grammar.
- Comprehensive approach related topics viz - Social, Political, Economical, Legal //language and Technical (SPELT).
- "kiss" Principle (keep it Smiling, and Simple Straight)
- Positive outlook
- Conclude with a thanking note.

In this methodology, the group of candidates is given a topic or a situation, typically given some time to think about the same, and then asked to discuss it among themselves for a specific duration.

GD helps to achieve group goals as well as individual goals. The examiner can evaluate both the personality traits and group skills of candidates participating in a GD. It is basically a situation test wherein a sample of a candidate's group worthiness and potential as a worker comes out quite explicitly.

Person 5: But we need to consider the emotional attachment of the Andhra people with Hyderabad. It's like being treated as strangers in their actual Capital. It lies in the hands of Telengana government to treat other Andhra people with equal importance

Person 6: It's not just about the emotional part. Almost half of the important educational institutes of Andhra were in Hyderabad. An IIT and an NIT (Warangal) were common for both the state's students. Previously, the students are almost in verge of losing their domicile states now. This is really pathetic. When considering in students' perspective, so, I don't think that this really leads to development rather than disaster.

educational institutes. They don't need to depend on the already existing ones. We can think about other deviated states.

Conclusion -

Ideally, our nation needs a commission to make decision on the reorganisation of states. Politicians have short term political gains and narrow minded reasons. They should not be the reason for the formation of new states. For ex- Krishna committee was formed on understanding the people's concern in the division of Andhra and Telangana. Even with the formation of 4 new states, India has just crossed over half as many states in USA. Significantly the formation of sub-national units provides solutions that could help in checking the economic divergence among different states, by maintaining the economic efficiency. Indian government must ensure that all the states formed are provided with equal opportunity to develop.

- 2) Jharkhand and Uttarakhand have more schools per 1000 children when compared to that of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. It was 13 and 17 against 6 and 7.
- 3) Madhya Pradesh and Chattisgarh has reduced Infant Mortality rate to a considerable amount by 29 and 31 pts respectively.
- 4) In agriculture, Jharkhand has a yearly growth of 10%. While Bihar's growth was as low as 2% between 2000 and 2011

Initiating a GD is a high profit - high loss strategy. When you initiate a GD, you not only grab the opportunity to speak, you also grab the attention of the examiner and follow candidate.

When you start a GD, you are responsible for putting it into the right perspective or framework. So initiate one only if you have in-depth knowledge about the topic at hand.

Tip-2: Body of Group Discussion

- Quotes
- Definition
- Question
- Shock Statement
- Facts, figures and statistics
- Short Story
- General Statement

1) Quotes → effective way of initiating a GD.

Eg: Customer Is King ← Topic

There is only one boss : the customer
↑ Quotes

2) Definition :- Start a GD by defining the topic or an important term in the topic.

Ex:- Topic - Advertising is a diplomatic Way of Telling a lie.

Defn :- Any paid form of non-personal presentation and promotion of ideas, goods or services through mass media like newspapers, magazines, television or radio by an identified sponsor.

3) Question :- Asking a question is an impact way of starting a GD.

Ex:- Should India go to war with pakistan
(Topic)

Ques :- What does war bring to the people?
We had four clashes with pakistan. What have we achieved?

4) Shock Statement :- Initiating a GD with a shocking statement is best way to grab immediate attention and put forth your point.

Ex:- Topic :- Impact of population on Indian Economy

Shock Statement :- Population clock - that ticks away relentlessly tracks 33 births a minute, 2000 an hour, 480000 a day about 12 million a year.

5. Facts, figure and statistics :- If you decide to initiate your GD with facts, figure and statistics then make sure to quote them accurately.

Ex:- You can say, approximately 70 percent of the Indian population stays in rural areas, but you cannot say 30 states of India instead of 28.

6. Short Story :- Use a short story in GD topic like - Attitude is Everything.

Ex:- Initiated as "A child once asked a balloon vendor, who was selling helium gas balloon, child asked - Whether blue or green color balloon will go high in the sky. Vendor told it not color of bag (outside) what is inside you make you to ~~be~~ go high.

7) Use general statement :- To put GD in proper perspective.

Ex:- Topic :- Should Sonia Gandhi be prime ~~mine~~ minister of India.
→ Let's first find out the qualities

one needs to be a good prime minister of India.

Then we compare these qualities with those qualities of Mrs. Gandhi.

TIP 3:- Summarizing Ds Concluding

Most GD's don't really have conclusions, but every GD is summarized. You can summarize what group has discussed in the GD in a nutshell.

DO's

- Speak fluently and politely
- Respect contribution of every speaker.
- Try to stick to the discussion topic. Don't mingle irrelevant information.
- Be aware of body language.

DON'T's

- don't lose your temper.
- don't shout.
- don't dominate the discussion.
- don't interrupt. Wait for speaker to finish.
- don't draw too much on personal experience.
